Mesa Court Towers Wins 2017 Project of the Year

We are pleased to announce that Mesa Court Towers won the <u>2017 Project of the Year from Design-Build Institute of America (DBIA)</u>. DBIA is a national organization that defines, teaches and promotes best practices in design-build project delivery.

Completed in 2016, the 250,000 square-foot, state-of-the-art housing complex provides housing for 1,016 first-year students. Amenities include study areas, computer labs, great rooms, a fitness center, recreational room, student office space, community kitchenettes, and laundry facilities. Mesa Court Towers is also home to The Anteatery, a sustainable dining facility that offers healthy menus and follows zero-waste food service operations.

By using the design-build process, the \$134 million project opened only 28 months after the contract award date, at least a year faster than traditional contracting methods would allow. UCl's Building Advisory Committee (Design & Construction Services, Student Affairs, and Student Housing), in partnership with general contractor Hensel Phelps Construction, architectural firm Mithun, Inc., and engineering services from KHR Associates and Michael Wall Engineering, made this project a success and worthy of this prestigious award.
