Danica, Facilities Management student intern wrote and won \$4,093 in a TGIF Sustainability grant. This collaborative project included Strategic Communications as well as the sign making expertise of Dan Crout. The grant paid for the new sign panels that will feature interchangeable informational signs to teach passersby about different sustainability programs on campus. Danica's waste audits and research study will determine the impact of these new signs. This project supports the overall campus waste Diversion Goals of Zero Waste by 2020.
